New Building for Lak Aruna Education Centre

Lak Aruna Foundation is an Education Centre in Hingurakaduwa, Passara, Sri Lanka. It was initiated in 2004 by a young educated villager with a vision, to develop IT, Maths and English skills of children in this remote village. Starting with 12 students using a donated computer in 2004, the Centre now caters for over 300 students. LSF has been supporting, and continues to support Lak Aruna, by providing teaching aids such as computers and books, improving library facilities, teacher salaries, sponsoring foreign volunteers for teaching, and funding for an administrator to ensure good governance. Several past students have progressed well and now work in the IT industry in Sri Lanka, with one of them finding employment in Maldives.

Existing Buildings





The buildings in which classes are being conducted are dilapidated, and totally inadequate for the current student population. Over the past two years LSF has been planning to provide a new building by acquiring land and obtaining building approvals for this purpose. In September 2012, a contract was awarded to construct the building, 40 feet long by 24 feet wide, with expected completion in February 2013. The cost of the building project is A\$44,000. LSF plans to meet this expenditure by raising additional funds, as well as postponing all non-urgent projects.


Assisting Children with Disabilities

LSF recently joined hands with "Volunteers to Assist Children with Disabilities" (VACD). The objective of VACD is to assist children with disabilities and their families to overcome discrimination and social stigma, while addressing their health and educational concerns to foster their skills and talents so that they can become productive and independent citizens in the future. Currently assistance is provided to 69 disabled children in 9 local schools in Bandarawela District, Sri Lanka. Some key achievements to date are:

- Fortnightly Health Clinics for children that provide full medical checkups and maintain a Medical Record Book for each child. Two local doctors provide these services free of charge.
- A qualified expert from the Western Autism School of Victoria, Australia is working with teachers, children, parents, community leaders and medical authorities to introduce modern therapeutic methods and improve teaching techniques.
- ❖ A Special Skills Training Program for the children with the help of specially trained teachers.
- Establishing a 'Mothers' Union of Children with Special Needs' – a support group for the parents of disabled children.

Of the 14 computers, 4 have been given to Kahawa Rathanasara Maha Vidyalaya, which also receives funding for IT education from Sydney Boys High School through LSF. Artificial Legs for Deserving

Funding for 10 artificial legs was provided by LSF to needy persons, through the Centre for Handicapped in Kandy. This has enabled 9 people (one child requiring both legs to be fitted) to become independent and go about their daily routines without the assistance of their immediate families. This is the fourth successive year that LSF has funded artificial legs, having provided 10 artificial legs to needy recipients every year.

Fifty well deserving patients from the Polonnaruwa District , Sri Lanka, regained their vision as a result of cataract surgeries undertaken at Polonnaruwa Hospital.
